Program Descriptions:

Where the Buffalo (Bison) Roam: This PowerPoint presentation looks at the quintessential American icon, how the animal was brought to the brink of extinction and where it stands today. Geology, Climatology, & its Effects on Plant Communities: Accompany an Interpreter on a walk around the grounds or relax in the Leo Adler Theater for an interpretive presentation on the geology of Oregon and its effects on climate and the corresponding plant communities.

All About Oxen: Take a look into the most prominent beast of burden on the Oregon Trail. **The Varied & Startling Adventures of a Mountain Man:** Find out the story of "Probably" George Malvern in this adventurous living history program.

Preparing for the Trail: There were many decisions involved in making the choice to start a new life in Oregon. Explore some of the options, alternatives, and judgments the pioneers faced. **Women of the Oregon Trail:** Explore the role of women on the Oregon Trail.

Tall Tales: Experience pioneer tales from the trail along with music, coffee, & more at the Blue Mountain Encampment in the Interpretive Center.

The Original Meals on Wheels: Explore the methods in which Pioneers preserved, prepared, and partitioned food on the Oregon Trail.

Albert Fenner - Supplier to the Compleat Miner: Meet Albert Fenner, Mining Supplier, and find out what the life of a mid 19th century business man was like.

Velveteen Poinsettia Workshop and Tea: Learn how to craft typical 19th century fabric flowers for Victorian style holiday decorations. \$15 fee includes all supplies and includes fee for visiting the Interpretive Center.
