For now, we believe the following eight landscapes are the best places for us to be working:

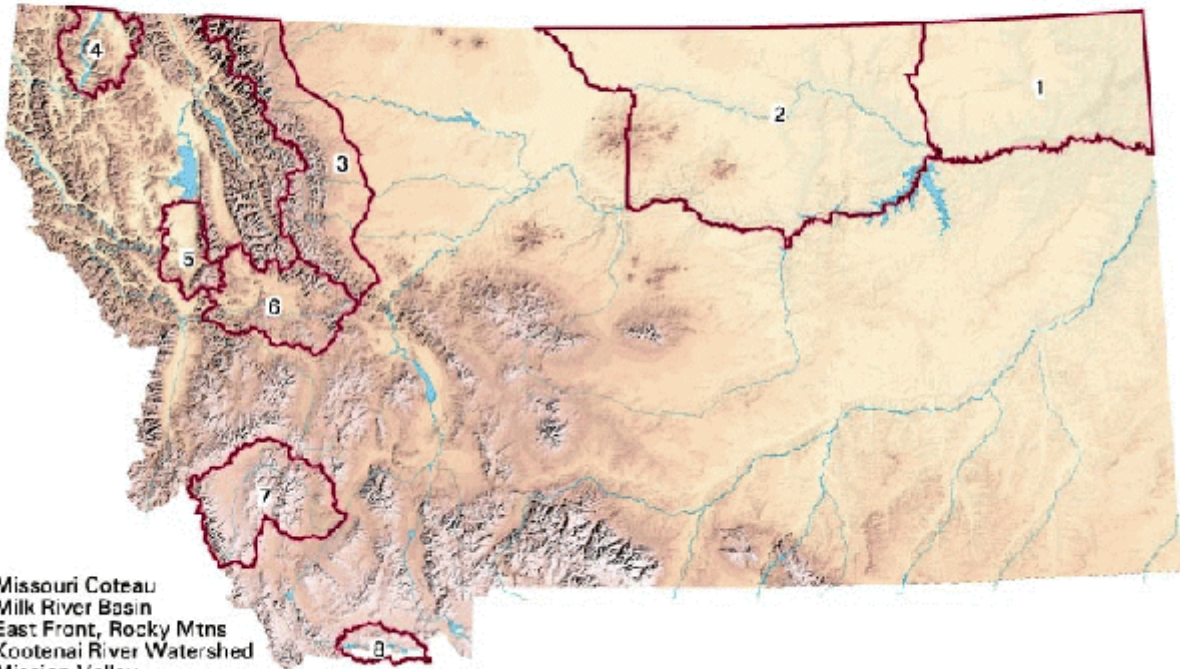
1. Upper Missouri Coteau
