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Dr. Frankos serves as the Director, Division of Dietary Supplement Programs (DDSP) and the lead scientist for dietary supplements for the FDA and is responsible for the full implementation of the DSHEA Act of 1994. He directs and coordinates policy and administrative activities within the Division. He advises on policy and management issues on dietary supplement programs, new dietary ingredient safety assessments, good manufacturing practice, adverse reaction monitoring, and related activities pertaining to dietary supplements. Before becoming the Director of DDSP Dr. Frankos also served as Special Assistant for Dietary Supplement Science Review providing toxicological and pharmacological evaluation of data used to assess the risks posed by dietary supplement products, Staff Science Advisor in the Office of the Commissioner, and as a Senior Toxicologist in the Center for Food Safety and Applied Nutrition.

Dr. Frankos received his M.S. in molecular biology from the University of Maryland, and his Ph.D. in Pharmacology and Toxicology from the University of Maryland Pharmacy School. He has over 30 years experience in the toxicological and pharmacological evaluation of data used to assess the safety of FDA regulated products. In addition to his FDA activities, he spent 18 years as a Principal in the consulting firm ENVIRON International Corp.

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
