CISM Records Updated By Russians

The center fire pistol individual competition ended in russian supremacy, seeing Mikhail Nestruev and Serguei Poliakov taking a double victory. Third was brazilian Julio Almeida.

The russian victory is emphasized by the fact that Nestruev's score, 591, is a new CISM World Record. Also Poliakov shot very well, his score of 589 equaled the old record.

Poliakov nearly saw his shootings come to an end after the precision shooting, because he disappeared from his shooting place during the break. The chief range officer announced for him many times, and nearly started the rapid fire part without him, when Poliakov finally appeared to his place.

The competition on Tuesday once again showed the necessity of being good both in precision shooting as in the rapid fire part.

This was the case with Nestruev and Poliakov. The russians were on places three and four after the first round.

Nestruev took the lead after the first ten shots in the rapid fire part. Poliakov secured his second place after 20 shots.

Leading after the first round, belarussian Igor Basinski and swedish Jonas Fyrpihl on

second place saw themselves dropping steadily during the rapid fire part of the competition. Fyrpihl ended on a ninth place and Basinski tied on 11th.

The center fire pistol bronze was up for grabs to the end, and saw many shooters on the last medal place during the rapid fire part of the competition.

Strongest on medals were finnish Jarmo Hokkanen, norwegian Pål Hembre and chinese Chuanlin Li. Finally the bronze went to brazilian Julio Almeida with 587 points, who scored 297 in the rapid fire part. Hembre ended on a fourth, Li on a fifth place and Hokkanen, after a mediocre second part on place 11.

Stephen Goff, from the US squad shot the result of his life, 588, which guaranteed him a crushing victory in the standard rifle 3 x 20 shot individual competition. The battle for silver was even. Four shooters ended on the result 584.

Glenn Dubis secured his silver with the best result in the last series. Norwegian Thore Larsen broke the american front by taking the bronze before Jason Parker and Shane Barnhart.

43-year old Major Stephen Goff radiated with satisfaction after the competition.

- It's great to end the career with a Military World Championship. Even better now that it

came with a personal best result. I first participated in the military WC in 1983, when I won. Now the victory came in my last games. A great start and end to my career.

I will retire at the end of the year, so now I have time to myself, and my hobbies, hunting and restoration of old cars, the Fort Benning resident Goff smiled happily.

Glenn Dubis was satisfied with his silver medal.

- The competition wasn't all bad from me. The level of the competition was really high, and I gladly grant the victory to my good friend Stephen, Dubis said.

Li Took Gold, Silver Was Solved In Re-Shoot

Atlanta olympic winner, chinese Duihong Li showed on Tuesday to be in great shape. Li led the individual sports pistol almost from start to finish and won it in the end with a result of 585 points. Second place was solved with a re-shoot, when russian Marina Logvinenko and belarussian Zhanna Shapialevich both shot 580 points. In the re-shoot the russian took the silver.

Russian success was completed by Irina Dolgatcheva and Galina Beliaeva who were fourth and fifth.

Li's weakest moment was the second series of the rapid-fire part where she only scored 45 points. The result dropped her into sixth place for a moment. Li however regained the upper-hand by shooting ten perfect hits.

The battle for second place was hard. During the precision Li was harassed by italian Barbara Stizzolli, USA's Roxane Conrad, russian Marina Logvinenko, polish Slawomira Szpek and chinese Jung-ja Woo. Most of them lost their advantage during the rapid-fire pistol. Russians kept on rising their position during the competition.
