


NASS wishes to thank all farmers and ranchers who responded to the 2002 Census of Agriculture.


The 2002 Census of Agriculture is the most comprehensive source of statistics portraying our Nation's agriculture.


Information from the census of agriculture is used across America in all types of agricultural planning and decisionmaking and is an excellent tool for providing information on all farmers and ranchers.


Since 1978, the census of agriculture has provided statistics on Hispanic farm operators as part of its demographic and agricultural data series.


The 2002 Census of Agriculture reported that 50,592 U.S. farms had a principal operator who was of Hispanic origin.
