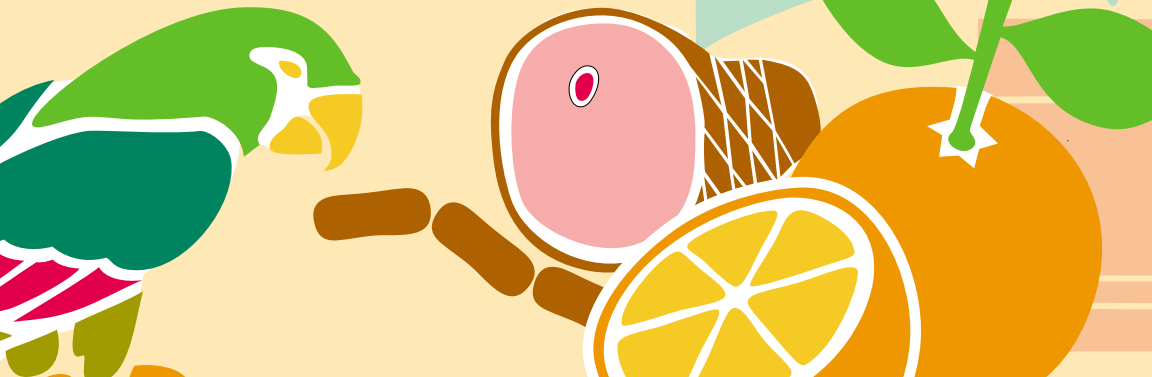


Help Protect American Agriculture

Remind travelers to declare all
agricultural products when
returning to the United States.



It takes only one piece of infested fruit or diseased meat carried into the United States by an unsuspecting traveler to introduce harmful pests or diseases such as Mediterranean fruit fly or foot-and-mouth disease.

Inform your traveling customers that many agricultural products are prohibited from entering this country. The reason: they can harbor pests and diseases that could devastate U.S. crops, livestock, pets, and the environment.

Warn your clients that failure to declare prohibited items could result in long delays, fines, and confiscation of the items. It's easy to assure your clients a hassle-free return from their travels and help protect U.S. agriculture, too.
