

The museum, after a two year renovation, has reopened with an updated and stunning new look. It is home to the Star-Spangled Banner, now shown majestically in its own chamber that creates a sense of being flown in "the dawn's early light." The flag joins the first ladies gowns, Lincoln's top hat, Dorothy's ruby slippers, trains, and cars in a gleaming new environment. A five-story skylight breathes life into the museum, and objects rarely seen before are now displayed in artifact walls throughout the galleries. Cafes and stores serve visitors.



Known for housing treasures such as the Hope Diamond and exhibit halls devoted to mammals, dinosaurs, fossils, and minerals, a live butterfly pavilion has now opened and as of September 29, 2008, a fabulous new **Sant Ocean**

Hall. Visitors learn how experts predict changes in the Earth's environment and how to conserve and manage coastal and marine resources.

Admission to our Smithsonian museums in Washington, D.C., is always free. Most museums are open daily from 10 am–5:30 pm; the Anacostia Community Museum is open 10 am–5 pm; the National Portrait Gallery and the Smithsonian American Art Museum are open 11:30 am–7 pm. All are closed on December 25. Summer hours are determined annually.
