## FY 06 Update to the National Centers for Coastal Ocean Science National Marine Sanctuaries Research Plan

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### Office of National Marine Sanctuaries–National Centers for Coastal Ocean Science Long-term Agreement (ONMS–NCCOS LTA)

#### FY 06 & 07 Request for Proposals

The internal request for NCCOS scientists to conduct research under the ONMS– NCCOS LTA was opened on 28 July 2005. The funding level from ONMS for this Request For Proposals (RFP) remained at \$800K per annum, subject to availability of funds. Four projects, totaling \$219K were deferred due to lack of funds and had first priority for funding in FY06. Of the four prior commitments, shown at the bottom of Table I (see below), two were withdrawn, one was rolled into a larger proposal for all sanctuary sites, and one was resubmitted with increased funds requested.

The eleven submitted proposals were reviewed and ranked by the corresponding National Marine Sanctuaries Research Coordinators based on the science and management needs of that site. The ONMS and NCCOS Program Managers received these results and conducted individual reviews before submitting recommendations to the ONMS and NCCOS Office Director's on 12 October 2005.

The total request for the eleven proposals submitted for this funding cycle was \$1.13M in FY 06 and \$1.13M in FY 07 (Table I). All eleven projects have a significant characterization element, with four being more specifically focused on biogeographic assessments. Six focus on aspects of the effects of refugia on protecting resources. Three address special topics identified as research needs by individual sanctuary sites. One will result in oceanographic characterizations for all sanctuaries, an effort that will contribute substantively to the larger goal of completing and upgrading characterizations for each site.

The Program Managers recommended an allocation of \$800K for each of the two years and asked that the ONMS and NCCOS Office Directors consider some program growth for this agreement. The work being conducted meets the needs of more and more sanctuaries each year, and non-ONMS funds are playing an increasing role in supporting the work. In recent years, the ONMS has received an approximate 4:1 return on its \$800K investment in the agreement.

Due to significant cuts to the National Marine Sanctuaries Program, funding was not available from ONMS to support FY 06 LTA projects. Program Managers conducted a revised ranking of proposals based on the following priorities: 1) building on past research; 2) parity among NCCOS offices and ONMS regions; and, 3) leveraging of funds. On February 10, 2006, the decision was made to obligate \$350K of NCCOS funds to support four proposals (Table II). This news was delivered to ONMS Research Coordinators during ONMS–NCCOS sessions of the 2006 Retreat in Kauai (see report – National Marine Sanctuary Program Research Coordinators Meeting 2006 http://www.sanctuaries.noaa.gov/library/alldocs.html).

The NCCOS Program Manager informed the PIs of their funding level along with the following additional responsibilities.

- 1. PIs will act as representatives for all NCCOS to the sanctuary sites where they will be working and assist the Program Coordinator in linking NCCOS scientists with site needs where possible
- 2. Submission of project results as a document for publication in the Marine Sanctuaries Conservation Series
- 3. An annual report (template will be provided)
- 4. A one-page end-to-end summary (template will be provided)

## Summary of Joint ONMS–NCCOS Sessions: Approved Changes to the Long-term Agreement

The report *Findings Regarding the ONMS-NCCOS Long-term Agreement (LTA): NCCOS Center Directors' Retreat* provides a summary and action plan from the August 23-24, 2005 meeting in Monterey, California. Leadership from the Office of National Marine Sanctuaries and National Centers for Coastal Ocean Science met in joint sessions with headquarters staff and representatives from all five Centers. The objectives of the sessions were to:

- Fine-tune the existing ONMS–NCCOS partnership agreement
- Better define for NCCOS, ONMS science requirements to support site management plans, regional networks, and national program mandates
- Review FY06 priority requirements as basis for the annual scope of work
- Initiate the process to cross-walk collaboration opportunities for FY08-12
- Identify long-term challenges

Several significant modifications and additions to the Long-term Agreement were made and included the following.

- ONMS is implementing the addition of a regionalized structure that will support NOAA's Ecosystem Approach to Management (EAM). The four regions are:
  - 1. Northeast, Mid-Atlantic, and Great Lakes
  - 2. Southeast, Gulf of Mexico, and Caribbean
  - 3. West Coast (including Alaska)
  - 4. Pacific Islands

Regional entities will serve as a central point of contact to coordinate with other federal agencies and NOAA programs that already operate at a regional level.

- > NCCOS liaisons will be discontinued and replaced by three components:
  - 1. LTA-funded PIs will play a greater role as experts for ONMS staff and advisory councils.
  - 2. The liaison site reports will be revised and incorporated into annual reporting by the Program Coordinator beginning in 2006.
  - 3. The Program Coordinator will sustain communication and tap into the background knowledge of former liaisons and PIs as needed to keep the NCCOS science focused on meeting ONMS research needs, conducting anticipatory science or technology development that will benefit the National Marine Sanctuary Program, and to provide technical assistance to sanctuary managers on an as-needed basis in order to most effectively implement findings and address unforeseen issues.
- New documents will be produced to facilitate rapid communication of ONMS management issues/needs
  - 1. NCCOS closed-loop one-pagers derived from LTA-funded research will cycle through management issue to research to consequence. LTA-funded

PIs will be provided with a template by the Program Coordinator to be completed and returned for compilation into documents for multiple uses by ONMS headquarters, sanctuary site staff, and NCCOS management.

- 2. Sanctuary Research Coordinators will produce a single-page research prospectus. These will be disseminated to NCCOS scientists as target areas for proposal preparation.
- 3. ONMS Program Manager will produce a set of Ecosystem Approach to Management issue one-pagers for each sanctuary.
- 4. NCCOS will co-author SWiM documents with ONMS.
- Peer review framework will be developed for LTA-funded research by the Program Managers. PIs will be asked to provide copies of research products as this process is initiated.
- > Program Managers will address ONMS–NCCOS funding needs by:
  - 1. Petitioning for funding early in the fiscal year to facilitate project continuity.
  - 2. Articulating how proposed research will address specific management priorities and performance measures to better affect the PPBES/PART/PBA process.
  - 3. Define the PPBES link in the LTA RFP to facilitate reporting later in the process.
- Human dimensions and economic drivers will be incorporated, where appropriate, in NCCOS research by LTA-funded PIs in consultation with Dave Loomis and Marybeth Bauer and in response to identified ONMS management issues.

Action in these focus areas will commence as lead staff are designated by headquarters and teams are formed.

- A joint technology team will address ship/small boat needs, funding requirements, science capabilities, sensor technologies, unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), autonomous underwater vehicles (AUVs), avoidance of duplication of equipment purchases, and better integration and assistance in development of the ONMS fleet.
- A joint ONMS-NCCOS vessel target team will address how to best achieve success with sanctuary vessels by integrating the needs of NCCOS researchers with ONMS development funds. Current ONMS vessels should be incorporated into joint vessel allocation schedules.
- IT staff from ONMS and NCCOS will address data and information management needs, specifically, a data portal service to provide access to GIS layers wherever they exist, and better links to NCCOS biogeographic assessments through the Census of Marine Life.
- A team will develop a consensus on the defining characteristics, components, and terminology for a given ecosystem. Endpoint goals for ecosystems, based on this consensus and understandable for the greater public, will be identified.

• NCCOS leadership will identify the NCCOS lead to work with Bob Pavia, others from ONMS and their partners to form a project planning group for a West Coast Ecosystem Symposium.

## <u>NCCOS Projects Database (NPD):</u> 2005 Projects in Support of ONMS Research Needs

Of the 301 projects entered into the NPD for 2005, 82 research projects were identified as providing some level of support to ONMS (see Table III and link below<sup>1</sup>). Projects are organized into three categories of support. *LTA-funded* refers to projects specifically funded via the LTA-RFP process (FOP to NCCOS). *Associated* refers to projects directly associated with sanctuary need and site but funded through other sources. *Supported* refers to projects that indirectly or more broadly support sanctuary management needs. Project information may be incomplete and some projects may be missing from the NPD and as such not included in the table.
