## **Don't Miss Tonight's Opening Ceremonies!**

This evening, as the crowd of proud families and friends moves apart to allow hundreds of veterans in wheelchairs to make their way front and center; as voices blend together to sing our national anthem; and as the flame ignites the official torch for this week's event, we will officially mark the start of the 28th National Veterans Wheelchair Games here in Omaha.

Make plans to attend the Opening Ceremonies this evening in the main arena of the Qwest Center Omaha. It is sure to be a memorable event for athletes, family members, staff, volunteers and guests. Athletes should plan to arrive in the grand hallway of the Qwest Center Omaha for staging at 4:30 p.m. The program commences promptly at 6 p.m.



All athletes should come to their staging areas as early as possible. The parade of athletes will proceed in alphabetical order by state, with the State of Nebraska entering last in traditional Olympic fashion. Competitors will be grouped by state in the staging area, and only athletes and qualified coaches will be permitted in this area. (Our teams from the District of

Columbia, Puerto Rico, and Great Britain will enter alphabetically as well, under those names.) Family and friends may proceed to the general seating area to wait for the festivities to begin. After registration today, you might want to get something to eat before the Opening Ceremonies begin because the welcome reception (where food will be served) does not take place until around 7:30 p.m.

Colleen Williams, news anchor for NTV from Kearney, Neb., is serving as the mistress of ceremonies this evening. Daty Keys, an employee from the VA Nebraska-Western Iowa Health Care System in Omaha, will sing the National Anthem, and the Athlete's Oath will be read by 2007 Spirit of the Games Winner Philemon "Rollin' Joe" Velasquez. Tamara Lawter, a local veteran and Great Plains PVA Chapter member also from Kearney, will light the Games torch at the conclusion of tonight's event.

Immediately following the formal program, a festive welcome reception will be held next door in the Qwest Center Omaha Hall A.

We look forward to seeing you at tonight's event, where our *Quest for the Best* will finally begin!



## VA, PVA Leaders Visit the Games

Secretary of Veterans Affairs James B. Peake, M.D., is in Omaha today visiting with veterans, sponsors and Games staff. "I applaud all of the veterans participating as they strive to achieve their goals during this week of competition," said Peake.

A St. Louis, Mo., native, Peake received his bachelor's degree from West Point Military Academy in 1966 and was commissioned a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army Infantry. Following service in Vietnam with the 101st Airborne Division (where he was awarded the Silver Star, a Bronze Star with "V" device and the Purple Heart with oak leaf cluster), Peake attended medical school at Cornell University and received his medical degree in 1972.

As Secretary of Veterans Affairs, he is the principal advocate for veterans in the U.S. government, ensuring that they receive the care, support, recognition and dignity they deserve for their service to our country.

Randy L. Pleva, Sr., National President of Paralyzed Veterans of America, is here at the Games as well and will also greet the audience at tonight's Opening Ceremonies.

Also a Vietnam War veteran, Pleva joined the Marine Corps in 1971, serving with the Task Force Delta Unit in Southeast Asia. He was discharged in 1974, became employed as a coal miner and United Mine Workers mediator. In 1982, he sustained a spinal cord injury in a coal mining accident. He lives in Tad, W. Va. We are pleased to welcome him back to the Games.

"The National Veterans Wheelchair Games are a mix of camaraderie, competition and courage," Pleva said. "They are rehabilitation at its best for our paralyzed veterans."

Many other VA, Paralyzed Veterans and community leaders are attending the Games this week as special guests, sponsors and volunteers. Thank you all for coming!

The Kick-off has become a Wheelchair Games favorite as our athletes join local

officials to demonstrate the technical skills involved in the competitive game of wheelchair basketball for the local community. Several local media personalities are expected to join in the festivities and try the sport for themselves. Mike Kelly, a well-respected media personality, will serve as master of ceremonies; Dave Weber, Channel 6 TV anchor, will provide the play-by-play; and Mayor Mike Fahey will officially welcome Games athletes, families, sponsors and staff to the event. Local team mascots, including the Creighton University Blue Jay and Harry Husker from University of Nebraska-Lincoln, will also be in attendance.

Medical suites are available at the Hilton Hotel in Rooms

4034 and 4038 and Hilton Garden Inn in Room 214. They will be open Friday, July 25 and will close Wednesday, July 30 at 8 a.m. Medical assistance will be available at all times (with the exception of the Opening Ceremonies) during the duration of the Games.



For those athletes staying at the Homewood Suites, Courtyard by Marriott or the Hampton Inn, medical assistance will be available daily starting

Friday, July 25 from Midnight – 8 a.m. If an athlete has a medical emergency during this time, the hotel operator should be contacted. The operator will take the veteran's name and room number, and communicate with the physician or nurse on call. If medical assistance is needed at other times during his or her stay, the veteran should go to the medical suites located at the Hilton or Hilton Garden Inn hotels, or at the Qwest Center Omaha.

## The medical suite at the **Qwest Center Omaha, in Show Office C**,

will be open daily at 6 a.m. and will remain open until the last event in that location has ended. In the case of a life-threatening emergency, please have the hotel operator call 911.

Only registered athletes or registered volunteers on duty may be treated by Games' medical staff. A list of local emergency clinics and hospitals will be available for family members who need medical assistance.
