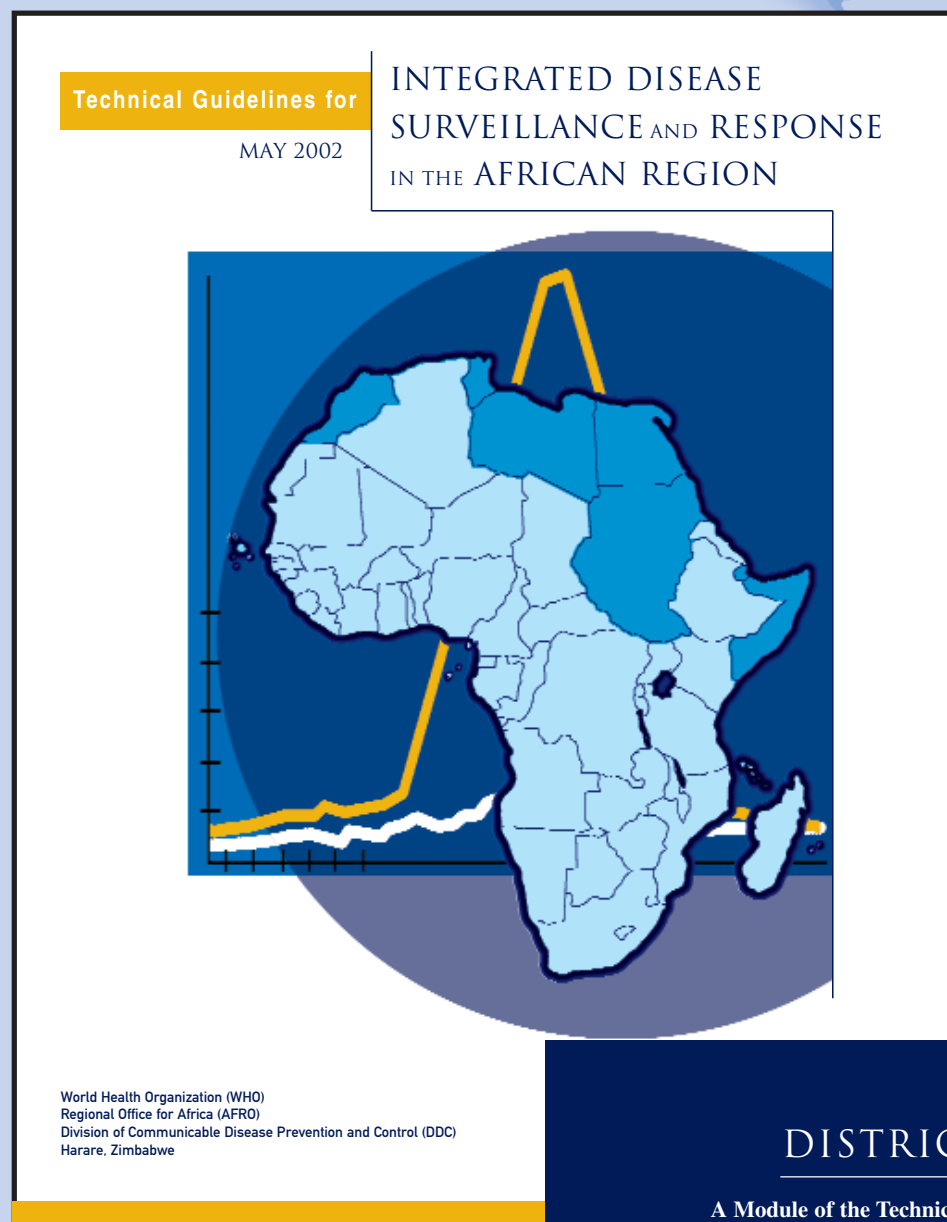


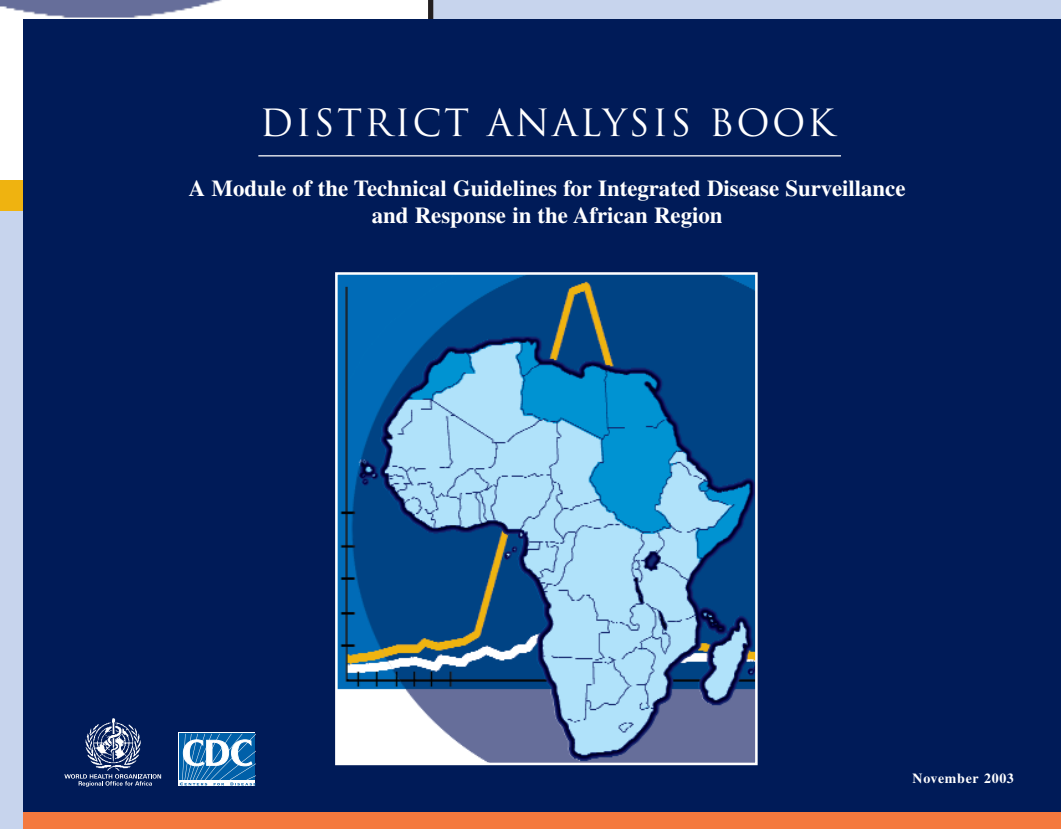
Integrated Disease Surveillance and Response (IDSR) in the African Region

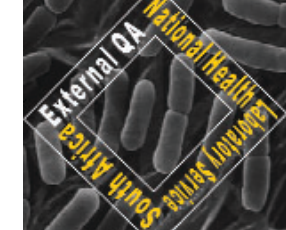
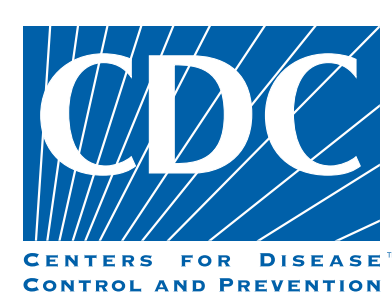


Goals
