The Varied & Startling Adventures of a Mountain Man: Find out the story of “Probably” George Malvern in this adventurous living history program.

Women of the Oregon Trail: Explore the role of women on the Oregon Trail.

Albert Fenner - Supplier to the Compleat Miner: Meet Albert Fenner, Mining Supplier, and find out what the life of a mid 19th century business man was like.

Velveteen Poinsettia Workshop and Tea: Learn how to craft typical 19th century fabric flowers for Victorian style holiday decorations. \$15 fee includes all supplies and includes fee for visiting the Interpretive Center.
