

# Number of farms

## **Market Value of Production**

\$24,693,000 in 2002, \$29,891,000 in 1997, down 17 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$13,381,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$11,312,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$51,659 in 2002, \$67,322 in 1997, down 23 percent.


## **Government Payments**
