

848 acres in 2002, 993 acres in 1997, down 15 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$130,667,000 in 2002, \$155,337,000 in 1997, down 16 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$39,139,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$91,528,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$221,095 in 2002, \$305,181 in 1997, down 28 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
