

\$276,113,000 in 2002, \$257,294,000 in 1997, up 7 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$31,007,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$245,106,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$788,894 in 2002, \$967,270 in 1997, down 18 percent.


Government Payments
