

# Monroe, West Virginia



#### **Number of farms**

682 farms in 2002, 707 farms in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### Land in farms

145,054 acres in 2002, 142,308 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

#### Average size of farm

213 acres in 2002, 201 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$17,236,000 in 2002, \$19,864,000 in 1997, down 13 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,021,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$16,215,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$25,273 in 2002, \$28,096 in 1997, down 10 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
