Crop sales accounted for \$1,660,313 of the total value in 2002.

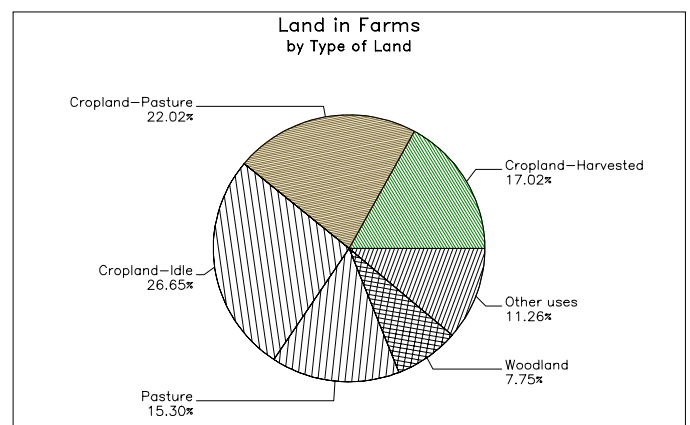
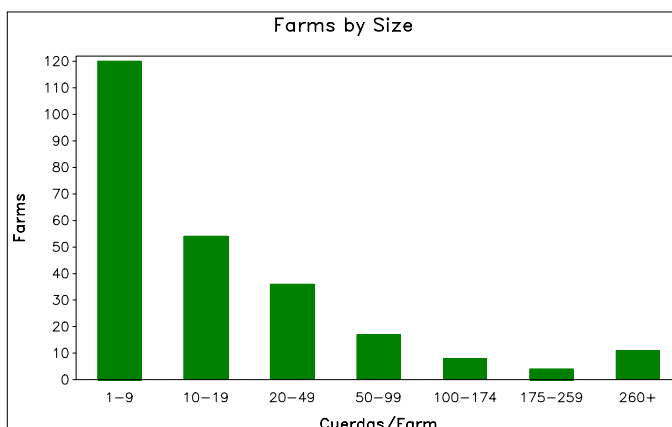
Livestock sales accounted for \$303,071 of the total value in 2002.
