


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Ashe, North Carolina

#### **Number of farms**

1,152 farms in 2002, 1,290 farms in 1997, down 11 percent.

#### Land in farms

107,930 acres in 2002, 114,399 acres in 1997, down 6 percent.

### Average size of farm

94 acres in 2002, 89 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$29,181,000 in 2002, \$24,214,000 in 1997, up 21 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$23,312,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$5,869,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$25,331 in 2002, \$18,770 in 1997, up 35 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
