

Market Value of Production

\$27,877,000 in 2002, \$18,000,000 in 1997, up 55 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$27,531,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$346,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$56,318 in 2002, \$33,646 in 1997, up 67 percent.


Government Payments
