

\$89,727,000 in 2002, \$107,937,000 in 1997, down 17 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$19,322,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$70,406,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$582,644 in 2002, \$627,540 in 1997, down 7 percent.


Government Payments
