


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Martin, North Carolina

#### **Number of farms**

305 farms in 2002, 427 farms in 1997, down 29 percent.

#### Land in farms

110,677 acres in 2002, 116,274 acres in 1997, down 5 percent.

#### Average size of farm

363 acres in 2002, 272 acres in 1997, up 33 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$39,891,000 in 2002, \$63,810,000 in 1997, down 37 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$25,160,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$14,732,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$130,792 in 2002, \$149,438 in 1997, down 12 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
