Meat Goat Symposium Meeting Site Randolph Farm Extension Pavilion 4415 River Road Virginia State University, Petersburg

From the North (Fredericksburg, Washington, DC, Maryland, etc): Take I-95 South to Exit 54 (Temple Avenue). Take this exit then left at traffic light at the end of Exit Ramp. Turn left at second traffic light onto Route 301 (The Boulevard). Continue to the fourth red light. Turn right onto Dupuy Road (Wawa on the corner). Drive for 1-1/4 miles past VSU to traffic signal. Curve to the right at the yield sign crossing the bridge and continue another ½ mile. Go through the stoplight keeping straight. Randolph Farm Pavilion is on left.

<u>From the South</u> (Emporia, North Carolina, etc.) Take I-95 North to Exit 54 (Temple Avenue). Take this exit and continue as indicated above.

<u>From Northeast</u> (Staunton, Charlottesville, etc.) Take I-64 East to I-95 South to Exit 54 and continue as indicated above.

<u>From Southwest</u> (Roanoke, Lynchburg, Blackstone, etc.) Travel 460 East to *-85 North (Approximately) 10 miles from Petersburg.) Take I-85 North to Exit 54 (Temple Avenue). Continue with the directions indicated above.

From the East (Virginia Beach, Norfolk, Wakefield, etc) Travel 460 through Disputanta and Hebron. Stay on 460 West until the traffic light at Wagner Road (McDonald's on the right). Turn left on Wagner Road. Stay on Wagner until you see the I-95 North exit on the right. Take I-95 North to Exit 54 (Temple Avenue). Continue with the directions indicated above.
