Featuring fifty works of art in a variety of media (drawing, painting, printmaking, photography, and sculpture) depicting flora and fauna listed as threatened or endangered in North America by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Over forty-seven species are represented, among them the California condor, Northern spotted owl, Grizzly bear, Black-footed ferret, Oahu tree snail, Sonora tiger salamander, Mesa Verde cactus, and Texas wild-rice. This exhibition, featuring work by forty artists, is the result of an international juried art competition organized by the Wildling Art Museum.
