The Audit

Sources of information gathered may include the following:

- Interviews with employees and others;
- Observations of activities and the surrounding work environment and conditions;
- Review of documents such as policy, objectives, plans, procedures, standards, instructions, licenses and permits, contracts, etc;

• Records of inspections, minutes of meetings, prior audit reports, records of monitoring programs and results of measurements;

• Data summaries, analyses and performance indicators;

• Information on the auditee's sampling programs and on procedures for the control of sampling and measurement process;

• Relevant information from external parties, such as public communication;

• Computerized databases, websites, etc.

Practically Speaking

The audit conclusions are meant to address:

a. the extent of conformity of the EMS,

b. the effective implementation, maintenance and improvement of the EMS and

c. the capability to ensure continued suitability, adequacy, effectiveness and improvement.
