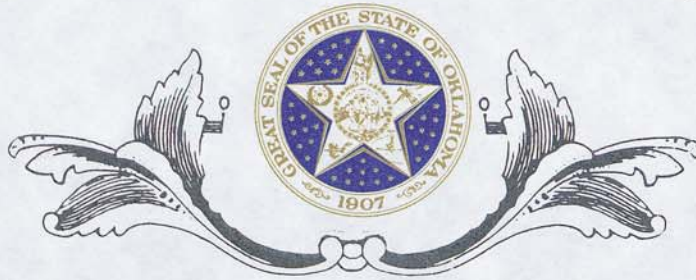

Proclamation

Whereas, the people across Oklahoma wish to live in harmony with the natural resources and leave a better earth for our children and grandchildren; and

Whereas, conservationists across our beautiful state work hand in hand with the citizens of Oklahoma to conserve natural resources and to create a healthy land; and

Whereas, leadership for conservation of natural resources on private lands is provided by a partnership that includes conservation districts, state conservation agencies, other federal agencies, tribes and the Natural Resources Conservation Service in the U.S. Department of Agriculture; and

Whereas, the Natural Resources Conservation Service and its predecessor, the Soil Conservation Service, have been helping agricultural landowners in Oklahoma meet their conservation goals; and

Whereas, the Natural Resources Conservation Service has established an important conservation partnership with farmers and ranchers in Oklahoma; and

Whereas, now is the time to recognize the contributions of the Natural Resources Conservation Service and its partners and to increase awareness among the state's citizens of the importance of natural resources;

Now, Therefore, I, Brad Henry, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim April 27, 2005, as

"Conservation Day"

in the State of Oklahoma,

and in honor of the 70th Anniversary of the Natural Resources Conservation Service.
