What is the name of the first U.S. spaceship to orbit the Earth? Hint: There is a number "7" in its name! (Answer: Friendship 7, Milestones of Flight)

How fast did the X-15 go in its test flights? Hint: Mach __, __ and ___! (Answer: Mach 4, 5 and 6, Milestones of Flight)



What was the "Spirit of St. Louis" the first plane to accomplish?

Hint: It was flown by Charles A. Lindbergh! (Answer: First non-stop solo trans-Atlantic flight, <u>Milestones of Flight</u>)

How high did Spaceship One fly?

Hint: It accomplished it on October 4, 2004! (Answer: 70 miles, $\underline{\text{Milestones of Flight}}$)



Who flew the Bell X-1 past the speed of sound on October 14, 1947?

Hint: His nickname is "Chuck"! (Answer: Captain Charles E. "Chuck" Yeager, Milestones of Flight)
