Rules and Regulations for McClusky Canal and Chain of Lakes Area

Please observe the following rules so your stay may be enjoyable:

1. Camping is permitted only in areas designated for camping. Digging or leveling of ground is not permitted. The maximum amount of time that you may camp at the Chain of Lakes Area is 14 days within a 30-day consecutive period. You must get permission from the occupants to camp within 50 feet of an occupied camping area.
2. Reserving a campsite is not permitted.
3. Unattended personal property may not be left for more than 24 hours.
4. Quiet time is from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m. Central Standard Time. Disorderly conduct and excessive noise is not permitted.
5. Campfires are allowed only at designated camping areas, and must be within provided fire rings, stoves, or grills. All fires must be attended and completely extinguished when you leave the site.
6. Fireworks are not permitted.
7. Uncased firearms and bows are prohibited year round in all designated camping areas.
Hunting is permitted in other areas as allowed by law (consult State hunting regulations).
8. Exercise safe boating practices and observe all boating signs.
9. All motor vehicles including ATVs must stay on established roads. Both the driver and vehicle must have a valid license.
10. Contact Reclamation for a permit to conduct commercial activities.
11. Pets must be on a leash no longer than 10 feet and must not be a nuisance or danger to other campers or the general public.

12. Destruction, defacement, removal, or alteration of public property or natural resources, cultural features, or artifacts is not permitted and is in direct violation of State and Federal laws.

13. Use of a metal detector is not permitted.

14. Littering and improper disposal of waste is not permitted.
