We would like to stringently oppose the proposed importing of poultry products (Ratites) into the United States from Australia and New Zealand under the Bill FSIS 9CFR Part 381 RIN-0583-AC97. This allowed importing action could ruin or totally devastate the American Ratite Industry, and what would happen to the many dedicated people and their families who have given years of time, energy, and money to build this industry.

The Emu (bird) is processed for the heart healthy lean meat which is under mandate inspection by the USDA. The Emu fat is being processed by American companies into an oil that is remarkable in its proven therapeutic uses. The American Emu Association is doing ongoing research at the University of Massachusetts, on the cholesterol lowering, anti-inflammatory, and transdermal characteristics of Emu oil.
