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Industry Recall Survey

- Joint Industry survey
 AAMP, AMI, NAMP, NCC, NFPA, NMA, NTF, SWM
- 502 establishments
 - 100% of the companies have recall programs
 - 96% of those conduct mock recalls



Current Recall Roles

- FSIS responsible for the recall
 - Team investigates, determines need for recall
 - Scope of recall
 - Product involved
 - Effectiveness checks
- Plant performs the mechanics
 - Provides information as requested by FSIS
 - Determines distribution
 - Retrieves Product



 If your company has been involved in a recall of FSIS-inspected product, in your opinion was FSIS forthcoming in providing all relevant information in a timely manner?

66% Yes



Industry Comments on Decision Making Process

- Information Flow is generally from company to FSIS
- Agency internal deliberations are generally not open to us. Not the case when a company learns of a situation, we inform and share our decision-making process
- FSIS withheld information making it difficult for the company to assess the situation in a timely and scientific manner



Solution

- Involve Company
- Share information
- Allow companies to conduct hazard evaluation or be a part of the FSIS process



 In the event of future recall(s) would you prefer to perform your own health hazard evaluation for submission to FSIS, rather than rely upon FSIS to perform the evaluation?

81% Yes



 Would your firm solicit this expertise from a third party, if necessary?

98% Yes



Issuance of Press Release

 If your company has been involved in a FSISinspected product recall, was the FSIS-issued press release entirely accurate?

58% Yes



Comments

- Coordination of the recall process frustrating
- FSIS public affairs groups issued a release without a review of accuracy by recall group
- 12 Incidents of incorrect product descriptions.



Solution

- Company draft release
- Company Review agency release



 In the event of future recall(s) would you prefer to issue your own company press release in lieu of an agency release?

92% Yes



Classification Clarification

- Recall used only for Food Safety
- Non-Compliant Product Retrieval



 Do you believe that FSIS has clearly defined recall classifications, including market withdrawals?

34% Yes
