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I would like to comment on the interim rules for BSE-SRM's. I currently am a VMO in a fast cattle kill in Washington State. I feel the regulations should require sanitizing all equipment between processing of each 30mo.+ carcass.

If scientific research shows that 30+ cattle SRM's could harbor infective prions, then when processing identified 30+ lots *all* the equipment should be sanitized between each carcass.

Also, is 180 F water rinsing equipment satisfactory to kill or eliminate the agent that is known to cause vCJD in man?

I believe if no more cases of BSE are confirmed in the next 6-8 months in the US FSIS should rescind the new SRM rules temporarily until more cases prove we have a problem. These interventions are very costly and may not be necessary if we only had one isolated case of BSE that was from Canada.

I believe the best answer is to <u>test all</u> cattle or at least all 30mo.+ cattle that pass antemortem inspection prior to selling product for human food. This would eliminate much of the concern and risk.
