## A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS teachers and school administrators know that children who have access to good nutrition at the beginning of school each day are more attentive and better able to learn; and

WHEREAS by meeting this need, the School Breakfast Program contributes to this Administration's goal of ensuring that no child is left behind in achieving his or her full potential; and

**WHEREAS** the efforts of foodservice professionals, school administrators, and community leaders throughout our Nation are critical to the success of the School Breakfast Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, in appreciation of all the dedicated, hardworking people who make the School Breakfast Program a reality in their community schools, I, Mike Johanns, Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture, do hereby join with the School Nutrition Association to proclaim the school week of March 7–11, 2005, as National School Breakfast Week. I call upon public and private schools and faith-based and community organizations to recognize the important efforts made by local foodservice professionals, school administrators, and community leaders to promote children's health and to help provide children with an improved environment for learning.
