I had spoken two days before to the United States Commissioned Officers in this same venue, but it had been five days since I had made a brief presentation to the Health Department Leadership in San Francisco, California, not presented in this archive, and seven days since I had spoken to the American Hebrew Congregations on AIDS in Chicago.

The Commissioned Officers Association comprised of many different disciplines represented in the health professions and is the ‘non-governmental’ aspect of the work of the Commissioned Officers of the Public Health Service. The auxiliary are composed of spouses and some friends of the Commissioned Officers Association membership and it was to that audience – not specifically concerned about AIDS professionally – that I addressed these remarks.
