### National School Lunch Program (NSLP) General Comments/Recommendations

#### **MEATS**

- •Pleased with the low-fat content of meats.
- •Would like unbreaded chicken products-grilled or baked.
- •We enjoy the new "meats" from USDA, chicken fajita and taco filling. Of what we receive, most are very satisfactory.

#### **MEAT ALTERNATES**

•Students love mozzarella sticks.

#### **FRUITS**

- •Shrink wrap raisins so they do not turn into stones!
- •USDA products are very good canned fruits are great.
- •Frozen fruits have been an excellent addition to the program.

#### **VEGETABLES**

- •Salsa great!
- •Would like tater tots or crinkle cuts instead of wedges.

#### **OTHERS**

- •Puddings great!
- •The students love the pudding in a cup and this is a good labor saver.

#### **DoD FRESH PRODUCE**

- •DoD produce is good, but more expensive than through regular vendor.
- •Want more money for the DoD fresh fruit and vegetable program.
- •More schools would like to participate in the fresh fruits and vegetable program.
- •DoD prices are not competitive with local produce prices.
- •DoD asks for orders too far in advance, sometimes trucks run late and we have to purchase locally and produce is smashed.
- •Do not receive fresh vegetables, however fresh fruits are delicious.

#### **PACKAGING**

- •It would be nice if the bags for the vegetables would be tied/sealed shut.
- •Smaller cartons- woman handle most of the deliveries.
- •Smaller packaging of all commodities no more than 25 to 30 lbs. per case.
- •Smaller packaging when possible.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

- •Generally our schools appreciate the commodities and find them to be satisfactory products.
- •Would like to receive any pre-cooked products.
- •Would like more processed (less labor intensive) commodities.
- •Would like more pre-cooked (heat and serve) commodities.
- •Like all of the pre-cooked foods offered.

#### General Comments/Recommendations

#### **MISCELLANEOUS** (continued)

- •What I receive in USDA products is great, but our state does a great job processing.
- •Most of my entitlement dollars are spent on state-processed entrée items.
- •Increase dollar level on peaches (A416), strawberries (A417), corn (A110 & A129), green beans (A061).
- •General favorable remarks about quality.
- •USDA has responded to the schools' need in low fat and low sugar products.
- •I think that the overall commodity program and products is as close to perfect as you can get! It has improved 100%!
- •Need lower fat entrée items.
- •We received our largest quantity so late in the year. Why can't we receive more in September and October?
- •Please cut out the flour and milk.
- •Many of these products are never ordered (unless perhaps it is a bonus buy because the schools have little use for them, and/or they are are not acceptable to students.
- •Overall Schools have been happy with the commodities over the past 2 years.
- •Schools stated the consistency is the biggest problem-especially when the label changes/supplier changes.
- •Schools suggest gearing towards healthier options with lower-fat targets and higher nutritional integrity commodities.
- •Schools would like USDA to offer more "Breakfast type" commodities.
- •School have seen improvements in the commodities over the year.
- •Schools stated "Thank you for helping me to prepare wholesome lunches for students & faculty," keep up the good work.
- •A school stated" The products have greatly improved- portion serving sizes are very helpful".
- •Schools would like more control over when Group A products are shipped like Group B.
- •Schools would like to have more commodity foods offered (quantity not variety).
- •Changes in products offered are meeting NSLP needs.
- •Things were much better 2 years ago.
