Subject: Crew Typing for 2008 Fire Season

This past winter, several groups, including the Area Commander/Incident Commander (AC/IC) Group, the National Multi-Agency Coordination Group, and the Incident Operations Standards Working Team of the NWCG, conducted a review of changes to the Crew Typing categories and qualifications standards.

Effective immediately, a decision has been made to incorporate the updated Crew Typing nomenclature and standards into the Mobilization Guide and Fireline Handbook. The decision will maintain one level of Type 1 Crew at the highest level of capability (meeting IHC standards), continue with the Type 2 IA and Type 2 Crew standards, and eliminate the Type 3 Crew nomenclature/standards.

It is our intent to utilize this new Crew Typing standard for this fire season. We, therefore, ask that you incorporate the attached chart into your Mobilization Guides. The new chart will be included in the next version of the Fireline Handbook (PMS 410-1) later this year.
