Dairy farming in Wisconsin

The Program on Agricultural Technology Studies at the UW-Madison estimates that in each year from 1992 to 1997, 1,860 Wisconsin farmers left dairying while only 344 started dairy farming. **That's a net loss of 7,580 dairy farmers over a five-year period!**

But there's something you can do to help new dairy farmers get started in a way that promotes profitable dairy opportunities, environmentally sensitive farming, vital rural communities, and scenic landscapes.

The Wisconsin School for Beginning Dairy Farmers

The goal of the School is to start new farmers on Wisconsin dairy farms by offering classroom instruction, on-farm internships, field training, mentoring, and identifying opportunities for students to begin farming. Over 170 students have gone through the program since its inception in 1995. Seventy-five percent of the graduates are farming; many have started farms.

The program emphasizes low-capital, grass-based dairy farming. Using managed grazing, grass-based dairy farms can be environmentally sound while providing a good life for farm families.

The School is sponsored by the Center for Integrated Agricultural Systems and the Farm and Industry Short Course, both within the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences, UW-Madison.
