
Walker Lake Anglers We Need Your Help!


The U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service, Nevada Department of Wildlife, and the Walker River Paiute Tribe need your help. We are conducting a research project to determine the short and long-term survival and growth of two strains of Lahontan cutthroat trout; a Pilot Peak strain from Lahontan National Fish Hatchery and a Pyramid Lake strain from the Mason Valley Hatchery. These trout are stocked annually in Walker Lake for recreational fishing and conservation of the species.

If you catch a Lahontan cutthroat trout please check to see if it has a tag. All of the stocked fish have a floy tag containing a reference number and contact phone number. If you do find a tag please call the number below. This information will assist fishery managers and researchers in improving stocking survival and will help provide a successful fishery in the future.



We need your help with the following information: Accurate total length (tip of nose to tip of tail) Fork length (tip of nose to the V shaped notch of the tail) Color and number on the dorsal tag Thank you for your time and enjoy fishing at Walker Lake!
