STATEMENT OF JOB:

The Child/Adolescent Services Clinical Supervisor provides professional mental health and substance abuse counseling services to the White Mountain Apache Tribe under the authority of Apache Behavioral Health Services. Also, provides supervision of professional and paraprofessional child/adolescent.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Provide clinical services: assessment, individual, family and group therapy for all required populations in a variety of settings, including: office, IHS emergency room, schools, Child Find, client homes and off-reservation settings.
- 2. Provide outpatient substance abuse services to teenagers and their families independent of residential treatment services.
- 3. Employ multiple therapeutic strategies when treating child and adolescent mental health or substance abuse clients, including: cognitive behavioral therapy, dialectical behavioral therapy, family therapy, group therapy, individual therapy and other evidenced-based treatments.
- 4. Ability to provide twenty-four hour on-call rotation, including irregular hours, weekend and holiday duty, during on-call shift.
- 5. Ability to maintain client records in accordance with HIPPA, ABHS, Federal, State, Tribal and local requirements.

- 6. Develop outreach programs designed to decrease substance abuse by children and adolescent and promote healthy family relationships on the Fort Apache Reservation. Participate on Tribal committees, taskforces, and other community efforts to address issues related to child/adolescent substance abuse and other mental health problems.
- 7. Oversees the screening and placement of children and adolescents in approved residential programs.
- 8. Provide clinical supervision and final approval of assessment/treatment plans for MST, AFS and child/adolescent therapists, counselors, case managers/clinical liaisons and interns. Stays abreast of most current best practices concerning behavioral, substance abuse and other treatment modalities and provide in-service education for ABHS staff and other agencies as appropriate. Ability to conduct multi-disciplinary case planning meetings as needed.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Must possess a PsyD, PhD in psychology or counseling from a regionally accredited graduate program. MA/MS in Social Work will be accepted with minimum of five years clinical experience.

- -Must have and maintain a valid Arizona license to practice at the independent level or be able to obtain Arizona license within six months of hire.
- -Prefer at least five years supervisory experience and one to two years experience working with underserved or Native American populations.
- -Possess a valid Arizona driver's license and have personal transportation, which may be used for business purposes with tribal reimbursement for mileage as applicable.
- -Must be able to work collaboratively in a rural multicultural setting.
