This is in reply to your letter of April 3, 1975, requesting an advisory opinion is to whether the Bridge-Jtone Kabuki "Picnica Wagon" is subject to Dicycle Regulations issued by the Consumer Product Safety Consumer in the Consumer Product Safety Consumer Product Safety

The regulation published in the <u>Federal Register</u> of July 16, 1974, (39 F.R. 26105) defines a bicycle as a two wheeled vehicle having a rear drive wheel that is solely human-powered (sec. 1512.2(a)). Since the "Picnica Wagon" is three-wheeled vehicle the regulations would not be applicable to the vehicle.

The "Picnica Wagon" is not subject to any existing standards issued by the Commission, however, proposed regulations applicable to tricycles may cover the vehicle.
