<p>Health and Medical Describes the policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for mobilizing medical resources under emergency conditions for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Lifesaving, transport, evacuation, and treatment of the injured. ★ Disposition of the dead. ★ Disease control activities related to sanitation. ★ Preventing the contamination of water and food supplies during the response phase and in the post-disaster environment. 	<p>ESF-8 Information and Planning Upon request provides:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Medical care personnel, equipment, and supplies to assess health/medical needs, perform health surveillance, treat the injured, evacuate patients, provide in-hospital care, disseminate public health information, and provide mental health services. ★ Assistance in assessing the health and medical effects of people's exposure to radiological, chemical, and biological hazards. ★ Assistance to ensure the safety of food, drug, and medical devices ★ Assistance in vector control. ★ Assistance in portable water/waste water and solid waste disposal. ★ Assistance in victim identification and mortuary services.
<p>Resource Management</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Describes the policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for allocation of resources to include personnel, equipment, and supplies, and service during disaster response and recovery operation. 	<p>ESF-7, Resource Support, aids the Federal responders in obtaining the resources <i>they</i> need to conduct their missions.</p> <p>Note that all ESFs above provide or can provide resources.</p> <p>Military support to civilian authorities may also be available.</p> <p>The Donations Annex to the FRP provides for technical assistance in managing donations, as well as an 800 number that can be used to take offers of donated goods and services for an initial screening.</p>
