Draft RFP for Nevada Test Site M&O Contract Released

A Draft Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Management and Operation (M&O) Contract for the Nevada Test Site and Satellite Facilities has been released and the National Nuclear Security Administration is seeking comments from interested offerors. The comment period runs through 4:00 p.m. Mountain Standard Time, February 4, 2005. The Draft RFP is available at the following web site: www.doeal.gov/nevadacontractrecompete. Comments must be submitted electronically, addressed to dsaiz@doeal.gov, and responses will be posted to the web site prior to release of the Final RFP.

A Presolicitation Briefing and Site Tour will be offered to prospective offerors during the comment period. The Presolicitation Briefing will be held on Wednesday, January 26, 2005, starting at 1:00 p.m., with sign-in beginning at 12:30 p.m. local time, in the Great Basin Conference Room of the Nevada Support Facility, 232 Energy Way, North Las Vegas, NV 89030. The Site Tour will be the following day, Thursday January 27, 2005. Requirements to attend the Briefing and Tour may be found in the Section L Clause entitled, PREPROPOSAL BRIEFING AND NEVADA TEST SITE TOUR, of the Draft RFP.

Offerors for the Nevada Test Site M&O contract may access the web page for other pertinent information associated with this solicitation. The purpose of this web site is to provide information regarding the Government's position and expectations associated with competing the M&O Contract for the management and operation of Nevada Test Site for the term commencing October 1, 2005.

The Nevada Test Site is a unique expanse of federally controlled land and facilities in a remote region of southern Nevada. The test site represents the United States' capability to support nuclear testing and major experiments that involve Special Nuclear Materials and/or other hazardous materials.

The contractor will be expected to provide the technical leadership and management expertise necessary and appropriate to manage and operate the Nevada Test Site and satellite facilities for the Nevada Site Office and to accomplish the missions assigned by the National Nuclear Security Administration through the Nevada Site Office.

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
