NNSA Administrator Linton Brooks Media Availability

Brooks to Discuss NTS Contributions to National Stockpile Stewardship Program

Administrator Linton F. Brooks, head of the National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA), will be available to the media to discuss the Nevada Test Site and its programs. This on-the-record media availability will take place at 11:00 a.m., Tuesday March 21, 2006 at the NNSA Nevada Site Office.

The Nevada Test Site is located approximately 65 miles northwest of Las Vegas, Nevada. The 1,375 square mile site in Nevada supports NNSA national security missions, first responder training, and environmental restoration and waste management activities.

Established by Congress in 2000, NNSA is a semi-autonomous agency within the U.S. Department of Energy responsible for enhancing national security through the military application of nuclear science. NNSA maintains and enhances the safety, security, reliability and performance of the U.S. nuclear weapons stockpile without nuclear testing; works to reduce global danger from weapons of mass destruction; provides the U.S. Navy with safe and effective nuclear propulsion; and responds to nuclear and radiological emergencies in the U.S. and abroad.
