State High Schools to Compete in Nevada Regional Science Bowl

The 13th Annual Nevada Regional Science Bowl will take place February 6-7, 2004, at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV). Thirty-two teams representing high schools in Arizona, California, Nevada, and Utah will test their expertise in the areas of math and science during the competition hosted by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), National Nuclear Security Administration Nevada Site Office (NNSA/NSO).

A mock Science Bowl practice will take place at 7:30 p.m. Friday, February 6, in UNLV's Bigelow Physics Building Lobby and Auditorium. Teams will have an opportunity to interact with their competitors, attend various scientific symposiums, learn the rules of the game, and practice answering questions using the official Science Bowl buzzers.

The 13-round competition will begin at 8:00 a.m. Saturday, February 7, in UNLV's Classroom Building Complex. NNSA/NSO will host a luncheon at 11:45 a.m. in the Moyer Student Union Grand Ballroom, and Nathan Tannenbaum, KTNV TV-13 weathercaster, will serve as Master of Ceremonies. The final round of competition will begin at 5:15 p.m. and the winning team will be announced at 6:25 p.m.

Teams will compete for the Nevada Regional Science Bowl title, a trip to the National Science Bowl, and prize money ranging from \$2,500 to \$100.
