This Standard Reference Material (SRM) is in the form of a disk, 64 mm (2 1/2 in.) in diameter and 19 mm (3/4 in.) thick. It is intended primarily for use in optical emission methods of analysis.

The certified portion is that extending inward from the periphery 19 mm (3/4 in.). (The center portion, 25 mm (1 in.) in diameter, is not certified.) Note: For x-ray fluorescence methods of analysis, either cut or mask the specimen to include only the certified portion.

²The estimated uncertainty listed for an element is based on judgment and represents an evaluation of the combined effects of method imprecision, possible systematic errors among methods, and material variability within the ingot. (No attempt was made to derive exact statistical measures of imprecision because several methods were involved in the determination of most elements.)

³The ingot designation refers to the single digit appearing after the SRM number as stamped on the SRM. This designation is used to differentiate among individual ingots prepared for this lot of material. Use only the column of certified values appropriate to the ingot number marked on a given SRM.
