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## An Oil Spill Trajectory Model

Scientists used computer <u>models</u> to <u>predict</u> how spilled oil from the *Exxon Valdez* would travel across Prince William Sound, Alaska, during the first week after the spill in March 1989. Predicting the direction in which oil will spread from a spill is an important part of the response strategy. <u>Trajectory models</u> help guide <u>recovery</u> efforts by showing which locations are most likely to need resources, such as lengths of <u>boom</u>, to protect the shoreline.
