

## Agriculture in Idaho

Idaho covers an area of 82,751 square miles. With all this land Idaho's agriculture is plentiful and diverse. Nature's bounty provides the perfect growing conditions for Idaho agriculture. Idaho's rolling hills, mountain spring water, gentle rains, and warm sunshine combined with state-of-the-art technology, produce superior agricultural products. In addition to the famous Idaho potato, the state produces over 144 different commodities and is ranked in the top ten in the nation for 26 different crops and livestock.

Agriculture is a growing industry in Idaho, setting record cash receipts in six of the last eight years. Cash receipts for 2007 were at \$5.68 billion, lead by the dairy industry. Food and beverage processing is Idaho's second largest manufacturing sector. Together, agriculture and food processing are the backbone of much of rural Idaho. Idaho agriculture is strong and remains the state's leading natural resource-based industry.




Idaho grows 80-85% of the sweet corn seed produced in the world.
