# Lífetíme Achievement... Elmer Goetsch

Elmer has spent over a quarter century serving Wisconsin's lakes. He has been a director on the WAL board since its formation and served on the board of one of WAL's two predecessors, the Wisconsin Federation of Lakes. A waterfront property owner on the Three Lakes chain in Oneida County for over forty years, he has served on the Oneida County Board of Adjustment since 1988.

Elmer is a knowledgeable, dedicated, productive, mild mannered, and selfless volunteer who is always willing to help others learn. He is widely respected by his peers on the WAL board, his colleagues within the Wisconsin Lakes Partnership, and throughout the Wisconsin lake community. Elmer's accomplishments over his long involvement in Wisconsin lake issues are too numerous to list. He has been, and will continue to be, an inspiration to other Wisconsin lake stewards.

## Group...Píke Lake Chain Lakes Association, Inc.

The Pike Lake Chain Lakes Association has been active since 1998, and is working to improve the quality of the Pike Lake Chain in Price County. The Association has an active volunteer monitoring program and has been monitoring water quality since 1999. In addition, the Association has been monitoring for aquatic invasive species for the past several years. They've worked closely with town government to pass an ordinance to protect lake wildlife, and have enhanced fish and wildlife habitat through cooperative efforts with state and federal agencies. They've established an education program that both distributes information to lake property owners and users and solicits their input on the direction of lake management efforts. Earning a lake planning grant in 2003 has allowed the Association to create a comprehensive lake management plan.

For significant achievement in building a strong foundation for future success, the Pike Lake Chain Lakes Association is presented with the 2005 Wisconsin Lake Stewardship Award in the Group category.

# Public Service...Patrick "Buzz" Sorge

Buzz Sorge has been a tireless proponent of sound lake management practices for his entire career at the Department of Natural Resources. He has been instrumental in the success of many local lake projects and has helped develop innovative statewide initiatives such as the Lake Leaders Institute, which prepares future leaders to preserve and protect Wisconsin's waters.
