The 2009 Program

Welcome to the Land of Mickey and the Magic Kingdom! The program and the venue are exceptional this year. The opportunity to meet jointly with the WSSA and SWSS is a first-ever for our societies, and we believe the experience will be positive for all attendees and that future opportunities to do this will be explored.

Your program committee has worked very, very hard this year. Program development is always a tough task, but having two societies meet together makes it doubly challenging. So many good ideas, so little time to fit all of those great ideas in. However, we are very pleased to take advantage of the opportunities that meeting in Orlando on the Disney property provides. We have tried to balance the chances provided for tours and entertainment with having an exceptional program of volunteered papers and symposia.

One of the major changes this year is our poster session format. We are experimenting, and need your help to make it successful. One of the complaints often heard with our old format is that there is not enough opportunity to interact with the poster authors. That, coupled with the need to handle far more volunteered papers than we would normally have, drove us to the decision to try a new approach. This year, rather than having one time for all poster authors to be present for discussion, we are having discussion sessions for the posters arranged topically. Twelve posters will be pulled out of the "poster room" and displayed in one of our breakout rooms for a specific two-hour period. The author will give a five-minute overview of their objectives and major findings, and then an hour is set aside for a discussion period on the thematic area that the group of posters represents. So, take a good look at the program, evaluate the poster breakout sessions that are of interest to you, and come prepared to talk about their specific research as well as the overall topic. We need your help to make these successful.

This location gives us a world of opportunities for tours, and we have organized the program to maximize your opportunities to participate. Whether you're interested in citrus, horticulture, golf, or the Everglades, our tours have just what you're interested in.

This year we have more than the usual number of symposia. This in part is due to having two societies meeting together; in part it's because we had such a large number of high-quality proposals for symposia. Each day has at least one symposium throughout the entire conference, and one of our days has two!

We have also organized the program to be very family-friendly, given our proximity to the many attractions of Orlando. For two of the days, Tuesday and Wednesday, we are ending sessions by 3:00 p.m. so that you can go see the sights on your own, or simply enjoy some time for relaxation. The hotel also allowed us to have a limited block of rooms before and after the conference at the same rate for those who want to spend a little extra time in Orlando with family and friends.

Our graduate program continues to be a vital part of the societies' activities. This year we have four events associated with the graduate program. First, our student luncheon is for all grad students, and we strongly encourage you to participate. Second, the symposium on Research Ethics is geared especially for students, and has been co-organized by the grad student organization. Third, from the SWSS we have a light-hearted Quiz Bowl planned for Thursday evening, and is not to be missed. Finally, SWSS students will continue to have the opportunity to participate in paper and poster contests.

We will have a General Session, Awards Ceremony, Business Meeting, and Awards Reception Monday afternoon/evening for WSSA, and Thursday afternoon/evening for SWSS. All attendees are welcome to attend both events, and strongly encouraged to attend the heavy hors d'oeuvres reception (you can make that your evening meal if you're so inclined!). Please participate in the reception to congratulate the award winners from both societies.

Our committee meetings have been scheduled differently this year to work with the combined program. All of committees are meeting at 6:30 or 7:15 a.m. Monday through Thursday, which allows everyone to participate in conference sessions and tours. Transportation

From the Airport: Exit the Airport North and follow to 528 West. Follow 528 West until I-4. Take I-4 West to exit # 68 and make a right. Take to the next traffic light and make a left onto Hotel Plaza Boulevard. Follow for 1/2 mile and the Hotel will be on the left. Taking I-4 West to Exit 68 (SR 535). Right on SR 535 to first light (Hotel Plaza Blvd). Left on Hotel Plaza Blvd. Hotel will be 1/4 mile down on the left. Taking I-4 East to Exit 68 (SR 535). Left on SR 535 and follow to 2nd traffic light (Hotel Plaza Blvd). Make a left on Hotel Plaza Blvd. Follow for 1/4 mile and Hotel will be on the left. Taking Florida Turnpike from Miami. Left on Exit 249 (Osceola Parkway). Take Osceola Parkway until SR 535 Exit. Make a right on SR 535 and follow until Hotel Plaza Blvd. Make a left on Hotel Plaza Blvd and hotel will be 1/4 mile down on the left.

If you are traveling by car or renting a car, please note that the WSSA/SWSS meeting registrants are eligible for complimentary self-parking at the Hilton
