



# Oregon 4-H Archery Mail-in Tournament

## General Rules

- Participants must be enrolled in the 4-H Archery project.
- Participants shoot for score once each month and may enter only one class: Bare Bow or Freestyle.
- Participants should have ample time for practice and warmup, then should complete the round except for a rest period if needed.
- Only target equipment may be used. Archery dealers may purchase Freeman targets wholesale from Martin Archery, Inc., Rt. 5 Box 127, Walla Walla, WA 99362; phone 1-800-541-8902. The other targets used in this tournament are available at most archery shops. 4-H'ers may make their own targets for practice.
- Aiming points (movable markers placed on floor) may not be used.
- Rounds should be shot during scheduled month and scores submitted on attached form #3611L to Stanley Miles, 4-H Youth Development Department, Ballard Extension Hall 105, OSU, Corvallis, OR 97331-3608, by the 5th of the following month. Results of top scores (ribbon winners) will be sent to participating clubs and Extension 4-H agents each month.

## Scoring

The spot or bull's-eye has the highest value; the outside ring has the lowest. The area outside the target, called petticoat or skirt, has no value. If an arrow completely cuts a line, it scores as the higher value. Bounce-outs are to be shot over.

### November—Gold Round

Target .....	60 cm, 5-color (24-inch target may be used)
Scoring .....	Gold spot 9, red 7, blue 5, black 3, white 1
Distance .....	45 feet
One End .....	Six arrows shot consecutively
One Round .....	Ten ends (60 arrows)
Possible Score .....	540 points

### December—Freeman Round

Target .....	18-inch green with white spot and scoring lines
Scoring .....	5, 4, 3, 2, 1
One End .....	Five arrows shot consecutively
Distances .....	Three ends at 30 feet (15 arrows), four ends at 45 feet (20 arrows), five ends at 60 feet (25 arrows)
One Round .....	Twelve ends (60 arrows)
Possible Score .....	300 points

### January—NFAA Indoor Round

Targets .....	40 cm, blue and white
Scoring .....	5, 4, 3, 2, 1
One End .....	Five arrows shot consecutively
Distances .....	Four ends at 30 feet (20 arrows), four ends at 45 feet (20 arrows), four ends at 60 feet (20 arrows)
One Round .....	Twelve ends (60 arrows)
Possible Score .....	300 points



**February—NFAA Field Round**

Targets ..... 35 cm, black and white  
Scoring ..... Spot 5, white 4, outer black 3  
One End ..... Five arrows shot consecutively  
Distances ..... Four ends at 30 feet (20 arrows),  
four ends at 45 feet (20 arrows),  
four ends at 60 feet (20 arrows)  
(total 60 arrows)

Possible Score ..... 300 points

**March—Novelty Animal Round**

Targets ..... Any #2 and #3 animals from NFAA  
Animal Round (raccoon and ram animals are  
recommended)

Distances ..... Beginning at 60 feet, shoot one arrow at the  
larger target; if it does not score, move up to 50 feet and  
shoot; if the second arrow doesn't score, move to 45 feet  
and shoot the third arrow. Then, shoot at the smaller  
target, using the same procedure at 40, 30, and 20 feet.  
(Arrows should be marked I, II, and III.)

Scoring .... Only the first arrow to hit the heart or body  
area of the target scores. If all three arrows miss,  
the score is 0. For the heart area, the first arrow  
scores 20, the second 14, and the third 8. For the  
body area, the first arrow scores 16, the second 10,  
and the third 4.

One End ..... One to three arrows at each target

One Round ..... Eight ends (8 to 24 arrows at each target)

Possible Score ..... 320 points

**April—Repeat Freeman Round**

Note: Improvement will be measured by comparing  
April scores with December scores.

**Awards**

Ribbons, provided by the Oregon Bow Hunters,  
will be awarded as follows:

- Ribbons, up to 10 places, will be awarded to the  
highest scoring half of each class.
- Additional ribbons may be awarded by the scorer.

**Publicity**

4-H leaders should arrange for local publicity.  
Some clubs' news reporters prepare stories for local  
papers.
