In December 1944, Congress authorized the Park River Flood Control Project. In 1948, it was renamed Homme Lake to honor Mr. H. G. Homme, a prominent citizen of Grafton, North Dakota.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers began building the dam in April, 1948 and finished in October, 1950.


