
Recommended Season

ACCESS: Travel US Highway 101 to the Duckabush Recreation Area, FS Road #2510 (22 miles north of Hoodsport). Turn west and drive 4 miles to end of pavement. Interrorem Cabin and Ranger Hole trailhead are on the left.



FACILITIES: There is a trailhead parking lot near Interrorem Cabin, a picnic area and a vault toilet. There is no potable water at this site but there is a hand-pump well at Collins Campground 1.0 mile further up the gravel road.

SETTING: This trail is a pleasant hike on a trail edged with sword fern and deer fern. It goes through an area of large second growth timber, and then drops steeply to the loudly sounding river below. The trail follows the river for a short way to a bluff that overlooks a deep pool. Above the pool the water churns in white rapids as it rushes through a narrow rock passage, cascading down to the "Ranger Hole" so named because the rangers who lived at Interrorem Cabin fished there.

TRAIL INFORMATION: This trail is annually maintained. There can be some muddy areas during the wet season, especially near the river. HAZARD WARNING: River contains swift water, rapids and waterfalls. River is not floatable. Use extreme caution in or near the water. 8/2005

OPPORTUNITIES: Fishing, excellent family day hiking, bird watching, and wildlife viewing. Please practice LEAVE NO TRACE techniques during your trip. Keep a close watch on children when near river.

CLOSURES: Trail is closed to motorized vehicles and stock.

TOPO MAPS: The Brothers – Mt. Anderson Custom Correct Map or The Brothers USGS Quad.

PASS REQUIRED: A NW Forest Pass or a Golden Passport (Eagle, Age or Access) is required on each vehicle parked at trailhead. Day & Annual NW Passes are available at FS offices and vendors, but not at trailheads.
