
## Slab Camp Trail #838

Hood Canal Ranger District – Quilcene Office 295142 Highway 101 S. P.O. Box 280 Quilcene, WA 98376 (360) 765-2200

ACCESS: Slab Camp Trail #838 starts 12.5 miles southwest of Sequim on FS Road #2875. Go approximately 2.5 miles west of Sequim on US Highway 101. Turn left on Taylor Cutoff Road to Lost Mountain Road. Proceed to intersection of FS Road #2870 and turn left. Continue on FS Road #2870 and turn right at FS Road #2875. Follow FS Road #2875 four miles to the trailhead.

**FACILITIES:** A three unit rustic camping area is adjacent to the parking area. No toilet or water.

**SETTING:** Forested trail following Slab Camp Creek to Gray Wolf River. Two riverside camps are at Duncan Flat on north side of river.



**TRAIL INFORMATION:** Trail is 3.1 miles in length with grades from 0 to 30%. The first segment of the trail is flat. Then it drops steeply, descending to canyon floor and the Gray Wolf River. NOTE: The washed out foot-log has been replace with new bridge across Gray Wolf River. Stock users should use extreme caution when fording river with stock. NOTE: Obtain Park Wilderness Permit for overnight trips into Park.



**OPPORTUNITIES:** Hiking, backpacking, horseback riding and fishing. Use existing campsites and do not camp within 100 feet of water sources. Treat all drinking water. Pack out your trash and leftover food. Practice LEAVE NO TRACE techniques during your trip.

**CLOSURES:** Motorized vehicles and mountain bikes are prohibited. No open campfires allowed above 3,500 feet inside Buckhorn Wilderness.

**TOPO MAPS:** Buckhorn Wilderness Custom Correct map or Tyler Peak USGS Quad.



**PASS NOT REQUIRED:** A NW Forest Pass or a Golden Passport (Eagle, Age or Access) is not required to park at this trailhead.
